**OPSC Changes to Facilities Inspection Tool (FIT)** 

- Approved by the State Allocation Board on April 27, 2022
- \* Required: additional building and site information
  - ✓ Total estimated building square footage
  - ✓ Total estimated site square footage
  - ✓ Restroom count

**OPSC Changes to Facilities Inspection Tool (FIT)** 

LACOE's approach to receiving school data from LEAs:

- \* Request via email
- \* Request in 2 virtual meetings
- If needed, request when communicating inspection date and in person during visit
- Not all have provided the information
- Intent / history behind the issue



**OPSC Changes to Facilities Inspection Tool (FIT)** 

- Any non-interior surface deficiencies should be included in "Overall Cleanliness" category
- Verification that restrooms are stocked with menstrual products to comply with current law and post notification (products in office OK)
- Number of custodial and maintenance staff (optional)

| Percentage | Description   | Pating    |

The Los Angeles County Office of Education provides observations on approximately 25-60% of classrooms, chosen at random, for this report. Not all deficiencies will be observed; this inspection is merely a snapshot in time showing the condition of the school on one day and is not meant to be comprehensive. It is the responsibility of the School and District to ensure that the site is kept in Good Repair as defined by Williams Legislation.

#### **Ed Code Updates**

- ♣ 1-year list of Williams schools reduced due to new criteria (625 in decile 1-3 for 12 years → 315 schools)
- Includes charter schools no issues in LA County
- Extreme deficiencies can be added to COE's website and reported to the LEA's Board
  - LACOE's approach: increase communication about the extreme deficiency at lower levels of LEA



#### **Post-Pandemic Trends**

- Cleaner schools
- Less extreme deficiencies
- Typical issues re-opening a vacant building

#### **Future Projections**

- > Increase in schools receiving Differentiated Assistance?
- > LACOE
  - 2170 schools for 23-24, reduced to 1531, currently at 1445
  - Standard inspector visits 180 schools in 7.5 months (Aug to Mar)
  - Need about 8 FTEs (currently have 1 manager and 3 inspectors)
- > Discussion:

- Currently working with 3 districts


